



PHYSICALS AND IMMUNIZATIONS

All Pre-Kindergarten, Early Childhood, Kindergarten, 6th Graders, and New Transfer Students are required to have a complete physical and immunization record on file in the health office no later than the first day of the school year. Students will be **excluded** if the physical and immunizations are incomplete. Please remember to fill out the parent health history portion and parent signature on the physical form. Please call the nurse if your child had any medical or health concerns.

Physical Exam Requirements:

- Pre-Kindergarten and Early Childhood
- Kindergarten
- Sixth Grade

Dental Exam Requirements:

- Kindergarten
- Second Grade
- Sixth Grade

Vision Exam Requirement:

- Kindergarten



ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION



All children who require medication to be administered during the school day must have a **Pink Medication Administration Form** on file in the health office for each medication. This includes non-prescription medications, i.e. Tylenol or Advil. This form must be filled out and signed by the doctor and parent.

The only exception is for inhalers used to treat asthma.

- Parents can either provide a completed Medication Administration Form **or**

- Write a note, giving your permission for your child to self-administer his/her inhaler at school. We will also need the box with the pharmacy label attached to make a copy of this label.

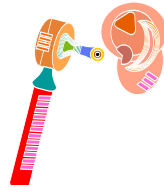
Vision screenings

- Preschool and Early Childhood

- Special Education Students including students receiving speech services
- New Transfer Students



Hearing screenings

- Preschool and Early Childhood
- Kindergarten
- First Grade
- Second Grade
- Third Grade
- Special Education Students including students receiving speech services
- New Transfer Students
- Students having known or suspected hearing loss



At any time parents and/or teachers can request a screening.



HEALTH GUIDELINES FOR CHILDREN RETURNING TO SCHOOL:

- ✓ Temperature less than 100 degrees without fever-reducing medicine for 24 hours
- ✓ 24 hours of antibiotic treatment for strep throat
- ✓ 24 hours of antibiotic treatment for pink eye
- ✓ **An absence of 5 school days in a row requires a doctor's note upon returning**
- ✓ A serious injury, cast, brace, or splint requires a **doctor's note regarding limitations** for gym, recess, or other physical activities.
- ✓ A child that has a cast, brace, or splint removed requires a **doctor's note regarding returning**

to gym, recess, and other physical activity.

- ✓ An acute episode of diarrhea and vomiting should have subsided.
- ✓ **Please report any case of doctor diagnosed strep throat to the school nurse.**
