SUPERINTENDENT UPDATE

Dr. Scarsella gave a brief recap of the 2018-19 school year, noting it was one of the best Palos 118 has had in recent years. He thanked the board for their support of the administrative team and teachers, sharing the following highlights:

- Reduced the number of chronically truant students by 50%
- Reduced the number of chronically absent students by 27%
- Reversed the negative trend in math MAP scores in the intermediate grades
- Achieved some of the largest year-over-year gains in MAP math
- Achieved some of the highest meets/exceeds proficiency rates on IAR since ISAT
- Graduated a very talented class of 8th grade students achieving near the 90th percentile on MAP math and reading
- Achieved the highest rating of "well-organized" at all three schools on the most recent 5Essential Survey
- 97% of parents said they would recommend or highly recommend Palos 118 to others

PRINCIPALS' UPDATES

The principals shared highlights from this past school year focusing on goals and student academic and social emotional success. The principals expressed pride in their students and thanked the teachers for their hard work rolling out the PLC's- Professional Learning Communities this year which helped increase student achievement, attain goals, and maintain a positive school culture. The administration pointed out that this success would not happen without the Board of Education setting clear and meaningful goals.

Justin Veihman was appointed school treasurer by the Board of Education for the 2019-2020 fiscal year.
