

Dear Palos 118 Families,

On Tuesday, September 8, we officially kick off the start to the 2020-2021 School Year! We know you probably have some last minute questions, so we compiled a list of frequently asked questions we have received from parents this week. You can access the Back to School FAQ here. We should all expect a few bumps in the road, just as we would during a typical school year. Our teachers and staff have been working hard all week to ensure our first week of school is a success and we are all looking forward to seeing our students during our Meet and Greet Days on September 8th and September 9th.

I know you have received a lot of information from your child's school this week so I will make my update brief.

Below are this week's metrics.

1. A return to Phase 3 of the Governor's Restore Illinois Plan

Suburban Cook County remains in Phase 4, which allows schools to resume in-person instruction. The test positivity rate is 6.8% for our region (Region 10). Source: Governor's Office and IDPH

2. Outbreaks of confirmed COVID-19 cases in schools

60 of 66 south suburban school districts are now in-person instruction to begin the school year. Palos Heights District 128 recently shifted to remote learning due to a rolling positivity rate over 8%. Source: News reports and Palos Heights 128.

3. Confirmed community spread of the virus

There is no confirmed widespread transmission of COVID-19 in Palos Park. Source: IDPH

4. Directives from IDPH, ISBE or the Governor's Office

After reviewing the most recent guidance from IDPH, the school district determined that the number of students and staff members that would most likely be required to quarantine due to IDPH's exclusion recommendations would be too disruptive to the learning environment to open for in-person instruction. The guidance includes the recommendation to send students and staff members home to quarantine for up to 10 days with only one symptom of COVID-19. Source: IDPH

5. District 118 Staffing

The school district continues to work diligently to address our vacancies. We have the following external vacancies as of today.

- Daily substitute teachers
- Long-term substitute teachers
- Elementary supervisors
- Paraprofessionals

The school district remains committed and focused to returning our students to in-person instruction as soon and as safely as we can. We continue to recruit and hire staff. IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION FOR MEET AND GREETS

In order to attend school on September 8th or 9th, students must wear a face mask. Prior to boarding school buses or entering school buildings, parents must complete the yellow Daily Symptom Check Self

Certification Form. If you check any of the boxes on the form, keep your child home from school. In addition to parents taking temperatures when filling out the form, temperatures will be checked again prior to students entering the building. Any student with a temperature of 100.4 will not be allowed to enter and parents will need to come and pick them up from school. I think we can all agree how devastating it would be for a child to come to school and not be allowed to enter, so I'm asking all parents to please be very vigilant in taking temperatures and filling out the forms accurately.
