



The Vaquita: the World's most Endangered Cetacean

If you have never heard of the vaquita, this is normal. Not many people know about these sea creatures. They are the world's smallest living cetacean (a whale, dolphin, or porpoise) and also the most endangered. The only surviving population of vaquitas is so small that it is located off the coast of a single fishing village in the Gulf of California, and the IUCN Red List lists them as critically endangered, the most threatened status on the list besides extinct or extinct in the wild. Last time they surveyed the population, there were under 30 individuals left, maybe even less than 20, and the population was still declining. That survey was taken in 2015. Many people support the conservation of the vaquita, but with such a minority of individuals left in the wild, their survival would be miraculous, that is if they haven't gone extinct unnoticed since the last survey. The reason they are going extinct is even worse. They get trapped in nets and then drown. The nets are not just any nets. The nets are set to catch a fish literally the same size and shape as the vaguita known as the totoaba. To make matters worse, the fish is also listed as critically endangered on the IUCN red list, and fishing for them is illegal. Poachers are hunting the fish and indirectly killing vaquitas because the bladder of the totoaba is believed to have medicinal qualities and can sell for thousands of dollars. Now these two creatures endemic to the Gulf of California have a big problem. People are killing an endangered fish in mass quantities for their bladders so they can get themselves money, and the nets designed to catch the totoaba accidentally snag vaquitas and pull them up. This is called bycatch. Many sea creatures, including the vaquita, dolphins, rays, blobfish, and many more are caught by accident. Also, when people are not overfishing the area, there are ghost nets floating around. These are fishing nets floating in the water after they have been used, and not just vaquitas are killed. Animals from dolphins to sharks to turtles to even gigantic whales have been snagged in these nets. The vaquita is in trouble, and not many people know it. If you happen to be reading this article, spread the word. Tell your friends and family about the vaquita, and tell them to tell their friends and family. The vaguita needs our help, and many other creatures, such as elephants, Cuban crocodiles, and many more need it too. These animals can't talk for themselves, but you can speak up to help governments, companies, and ordinary people help endangered species instead of hurt them.

Supersonic Whales



If you read the article above, you learned about a rare cetacean called the vaquita. A more abundant, but a rarely ever seen cetacean, the True's beaked whale, was sighted more frequently than usual recently, it was said to be seen almost daily off the coasts of Georges Bank to Rhode island, scientists also tagged one of these rare creatures, and found out that it can make supersonic noises. Before we get to that, let's learn about the whale. The True's beaked whale was discovered back in 1913 by Fredrick W. True, hence the name. Until recent years, they were only known from animals that were stranded from beaches, but they were recently sighted at sea for the first time, and have been sighted other times after that. Up to a year after those sightings, the whales were sighted often on the expedition of several biologists. For the first time, they also got samples of the mammal's DNA. A dozen DNA samples were taken, also biopsy samples and underwater photographs of True's beaked whales were collected. One other great accomplishment was that they tagged a True's beaked whale. A device called a digital acoustic recording tag was attached to the whale. It records the acoustic behavior and movement of the animal for 12 hours before it comes off. They got the first ever definite recordings of True's beaked whales vocalizing underwater. They made supersonic noises. You cannot hear them, but a computer program shows the sound waves. They also made a series of clicking noises similar to the noises made by dolphins. This great discovery showed a glimpse into a rare whale's life. They may not be as rare as we thought in the past, just shy. What secrets could the other rare creatures of the Earth like the giant squid or the deep sea frilled shark hold?

3 New Species Discovered in the Deep Sea







Recently, on September 10th 2018, three new species were discovered in the depths of the Atacama Trench off the coast of Peru and Chile. This trench measures about 100 miles off from land. It is a whopping 3,666 miles long, an enormous 40 miles wide, and a staggering 26,460 feet deep. It has covers an expansive 228,000 square miles. In these watery depths, animals still exist. Many bizarre animals, such as the frilled shark, the deepsea anglerfish, and the elusive megamouth shark (model shown) are found there in the deep trench.

The animals the article focuses on live there too. Deep sea trenches hold many mysteries. The particular creatures are three species of snailfish. Snailfish are eel-like creatures that live in the deep sea. They are very strange. The new species were temporarily named the pink, the blue, and the purple Atacama snailfish. Snailfish are in the family Liparidae. They don't look like the anglerfish or viperfish most people imagine lurk in the deep sea. They may not have a menacing glow, or teeth so big and sharp that they cannot close their mouth. They are small and translucent, lacking scales and looking kind of pathetic, but in their environment, with so many invertebrates to feast on, they are the top predators in the place that they live. The three new species looked well fed on the video footage, signaling abundant prey for the slippery new discovered fish. Also, a dead mackerel fish was lowered into the deep sea. Many invertebrates flocked to the fish. Footage shows a snailfish eating them.



How does a snailfish, a scaleless, small, slimy fish, survive in some of the deepest parts of the sea, where the water pressure could crush a human?

Their flesh is almost entirely a mushy, gel-like substance, pretty much supported by the extreme pressure of the water. There is a problem, though. The fish's flesh is held in place by extreme water pressure. What happens when a snailfish is brought to the surface? The result is very creepy. Since the water pressure is lower at the surface, the fish literally melts. The fish falls apart at the molecular level. Scientists managed to bring one of the purple snailfish to the surface in a carefully controlled environment. Scientists are learning more about the deep sea every day.



Teaspoon of all spice.


Directions:
